""And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant ... He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers ..."

(The Magnificat, Luke 1:46b-48a, ESV)

"Lord, you promise that not even the sparrows fall from the sky without your knowledge and even number the hairs on our head (Cf. Mat. 10:29-30). You rule the whole universe, yet you are concerned even more about each and every one of us and the big and small things that happen in our lives. Because you know us and care about us, we call out to you for help." Prayers like that one have been said many times in ministering to people in tough circumstances. Such prayers serve as a reminder of God's promises and offer a faith-filled cry for God's help, a plea that God is sure to hear and answer in accordance with his will.

The Magnificat is in many respects Mary's song of praise for God's faithfulness in answering the cries, the fervent prayers of His people and fulfilling His promises. Mary sang The Magnificat after Jesus had been conceived, when she had gone to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Both women were expecting, and as Luke's Gospel recalls Elizabeth's baby (John the Baptist) leapt in his mother's womb at the sound of Mary's greeting (Cf. Luke 1:39-45). That combined with Elizabeth's assurance that God was fulfilling His promises through Mary inspired one of the most sublime songs of praise in the whole Bible.

Yet we would do well to remember that, as Martin Luther once put it, Mary was not made of stone. Her faith and faithfulness are exemplary, to be sure, but she was a human being. It would be tempting to think that she angelically rode through the trials she faced, but that is probably not the case. Think of what she went through - Joseph, her betrothed, being informed of her pregnancy before their marriage, traveling to Bethlehem late in her pregnancy, finding the inns full, and finally giving birth in a stable – far from the comforts of home and family. Those trials were decades before Jesus' public ministry and journey to Calvary's cross and the empty tomb. We can be sure that all along the way, Mary's faith was tested and tried. Yet God's promises and God's faithfulness never failed. The Messiah accomplished his mission of bringing salvation to Israel, even the whole world.

As we celebrate Advent and Christmas, we do so with the benefit of history. In other words, we know the story of our Lord's life from his birth to his ascension at the right hand of God the Father. Until the Lord's Second Advent, the course of world events and the events that each of us will face in life have yet to come to pass.

Each Advent and Christmas serves as an opportunity to recall God's promises and God's faithfulness until Jesus comes again. Each Advent and Christmas is also a reminder that God still regards the "lowly estate" of his people, hears their prayers, and comes to their help in every time of need. Even more, God allows each and every one of us to have a part in making His goodness and faithfulness known as we live out our faith by sharing Christ's love with those around us.

Your support of LMS helps us comfort the hurting people we meet with the message that God hears us when we cry out in faith and that God is faithful to help in every time of need. We may not know what lies ahead, what each new day holds for each of us, but we know and praise the One who will keep our lives through life in this world to the life of the world to come. For that we offer praise and thanks to God! Thank you for your partnership with us. May God bless your Advent and Christmas celebration!


