Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Since the days of President Ronald Reagan, presidents have given a Saturday radio address to the nation. It's usually a taped message of up to 5 minutes. Their talks have touched upon many topics over the years -- something that he believes is important for the American people to hear about. Every once in awhile the president will have a special guest give the address for unique emphasis.

Because of the FCC's "fairness doctrine" that covers radio and TV, the other major party is given "equal time" each week - up to 5 minutes too. Over the years all sorts of individuals have been chosen by both parties to give the "response" which has cover all sorts of subject matters too.

How many of you listen to the President's Saturday radio message and to the equal time response?

I have to confess that I very rarely hear either. I really can't tell you what time they are on or which radio station airs them. Sometimes, though, I've seen those talks referred to on the Saturday evening TV news.

But who really cares about what those 2 groups put out each week? You probably only <u>really care</u> if it's something that hits home to you personally and/or individually, or if it somehow affects your family in some way. Otherwise, they're **almost irrelevant**, aren't they?

I've been writing "Thoughts From The Pastor" at various congregations since before President Reagan started his Saturday morning radio addresses back in the 1980's. I'm sure that a few people have thought that my "thoughts" were [or are] **irrelevant** as they're read them.

A goodly number of our neighbors, fellow citizens, even some of our relatives, and maybe even some of our own church members, look at what we are doing as disciples of Jesus Christ and see that Jesus has **no relevancy** for their life right now. Worshipping the one true God just **isn't** where they are at. Listening to the true Word of God just **doesn't** turn them on. They really **don't** see themselves needing any "saving" at this time.

Oh, they might hear something from time to time about Jesus Christ or some <u>convoluted stuff</u> about God (like it doesn't matter what you believe about God, or like all religious roads lead to the same place). But it's **all irrelevant** to them.

That's why after September 11, 2001, there was <u>no great increase</u> in people attending worship services in our country. Oh, attendance was up for a few weeks, but it then fell back to just the same faithful followers of Jesus Christ each week, joining together to hear His word and to praise His most holy name collectively.

By God's grace we know and believe in **the relevancy** of Jesus Christ for our life and for our eternal well being. We know that faith in Jesus Christ is the <u>only</u> way to heaven. Pray that the Lord and Savior's Spirit would help us to make the most of the contacts we have with people who don't see the need for Jesus Christ in their life.

In our conversations with anyone about Jesus, may we continue to be like those regular weekly Saturday morning radio addresses even if most people see Jesus as neither here nor there. May the Lord help us to faithfully live and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ where we are.

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your heart!


