Your involvement has played a critical role in the continued success of LMSN sharing the Gospel with hurting people. We are grateful for your support through prayers and your financial resources.

Here is LMSN in action:

A man is taken to the emergency room with a heart attack and upon admission his wife checks the box "Lutheran" as religious preference. Although they have not attended a church service for many years, they still consider themselves Lutheran.

All hospitals provide Spiritual Care, but their chaplains are not necessarily Christian.

LMSN is uniquely positioned to reach out to Lutheran patients at Seattle area hospitals who no longer have a church home. When confronted with a life-threatening illness, people are often left searching for meaning and hope. Our chaplain is able to reconnect people with the foundations of their faith — especially hope through the Gospel message. As circumstances permit, our chaplain also has the opportunity to connect families with a local congregation.

Second, LMSN is able to provide a Lutheran chaplain for patients and their families who arrive from outside of the Puget Sound area (Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Alaska) seeking the specialized care provided by outstanding hospitals. In that way, we are a resource for Lutheran congregations.

In addition to the visitations by the chaplain LMSN, 14 volunteers visit and hold monthly worship services in 11 Care Centers in the Puget Sound area.
