FEBRUARY/MARCH 2016 A.D. - THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Right after the season of Lent begins on February 10th, Valentine's Day is celebrated on February 14th. Valentine's Day is often a day in which "love" is the key word for the day. There are many ways that are suggested through which we can show "love" to our spouse, our children, our parents, and others whom we'd like to remember in a loving way on that day. But what about the other days of the year?

The Lenten season of the church year zeros in on how much God loves us each and every day of the year. It all has to do with Jesus! It has to do with Jesus' perfect life and innocent suffering and death on the cross. This He did willingly out of love for all people. Jesus did that because all people sin and come up short of what God expects of them in life.

By God's grace, those of us who have been brought to saving faith in Jesus by the work of the Holy Spirit are thankful to the Lord for the forgiveness of our sins and for our salvation. One of the ways we show our thankfulness to God for His gifts to us of the forgiveness of all out sins and eternal life is to love other people not only on special days (like Valentine's Day or a birthday) but each and every day of the year. God's Word tells us of the only reason this loving of others is possible on our part. 1 John 4:19 declares that "we love because [God] first loved us".

Since we will not have a full slate of midweek Lenten services this year (see note below), I will be using the Sunday sermons in Lent to help us zero in on those who wanted Jesus to die and on Jesus' loving response to each. Even though Jesus knew all that was going to take place in His passion, and He also know all those who would want Him to die, Jesus continued to love them all even in the worse possible times. In so doing, Jesus has set the perfect example for us to follow in how to love other people.

However, our love for other folks will never be able to match Jesus' perfect love. Never-the-less, let's continue to ask the Holy Spirit to assist us to follow Jesus' example as we love others (including our foes) with loving thoughts, words, and actions -- and seek the Lord's forgiveness when we don't. Lord, grant that to us all!

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your heart!

Council Report - Mel Suelzle



December 31st marked the end of our second quarter of fiscal year 2016. The financial results for this halfway point of the fiscal year are shown below. Our contribution income is off our plan at only 96% or \$2,019 less that we had expected. This is WITH \$3,000 of income from our anonymous donor. Expenses, being more stable, were slightly below our plan at 98%. This helped to offset some of our lower income result, but still left us with a net shortfall of income after expenses of \$1,390 for the first half of our fiscal year.

PROPERTY SALE UPDATE Our sales agreement is still in place and we have no reason to believe our schedule to close this sale will not occur mid-June. This will be in time for our FY2017 budget that will reflect the sale proceeds and retirement of our Narthex mortgage.



SANTA STOCKING SUMMARY Our Santa Stocking program for 2015 was concluded during December. The contributions from the congregation totaled \$538. This amount was added to the Thrivent contribution and \$350 from remaining memorial funds to total \$1006 for distribution. At the January 12th Council meeting, it was decided to distribute \$200 to each of the following:

Lutheran Community Service – Lynnwood Lutheran Ministries – Seattle Kid for Clothes Everett Gospel Mission Heating assistance to a congregational member

With changes to the Thrivent programs we may not receive funds as we have in the past. However, the generosity of the members of St Timothy has always been strong and there is no reason that we could not continue the program regardless of any changes to the Thrivent programs.

The Santa Stocking program has supported \$5600 for social ministry programs in the past 5 years. This program is one of several social ministry programs that Pat Jones championed at St Timothy. The people of St Timothy are generous and need only a leader to produce bring this generosity to aid the needy in our community. We need someone to step up to take this leadership position to keep Pat's programs going forward. Please give some thought to giving or your time and talent to keep this important program continuing.


