August / September 2017 A.D. – THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

When we went to visit my mother in the early part of July, we drove to the Oregon coast for a visit. The day before we arrived at Depot Bay a truck carrying several containers of live eels had an accident. One of their 7,500 pound containers of live eels slid off the flatbed and hit a few cars. What a slimy mess on the cars and the roadway!! People were still cleaning it up the dead ells the next day when we drove by the accident scene.

Usually something like that would be the big news in a small town for 3 or 4 days. But not in Depot Bay! The mayor was worried, but the businesses were all excited, about what was going to take place on August 21, 2017, in the 7 a.m. hour that day in Depot Bay. At that time of the day, there will be a total eclipse of the sun by the moon that will last around 2 minutes over Depot Bay. Everyone expects the small community to be overflowing with people. This total eclipse will then move all the way across our country until it exits over North and South Carolina.

My sister who lives in Woodburn, Oregon and one of my cousins who lives out in the middle of no where in eastern Oregon will also experience the <u>total eclipse</u> of the sun for a brief time. My sister told that she has had phone calls and emails from people who want to stay at her home and be able to see the <u>total eclipse</u> without having to fight the traffic that morning. We here in the Snohomish county area will only have a 90% eclipse that morning.

T-shirts, hoodies, posters, and other memorabilia about the August 21, 2017, total eclipse of the sun over Oregon could be found even in Portland! However, in my looking over that stuff, I didn't see any message that indicated that this special event between the sun and the moon was a sign of the close of the age and the returning soon of Jesus Christ.

I wonder what sort of sermons will be preached the day before (Sunday) in those areas that will experience that <u>total eclipse</u>. Here at St. Timothy, I will be continuing preaching on the Lord's Prayer -- and in particular that Sunday the 5th petition: **forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us** (Matthew 6:12).

Matthew 24 records that during Holy Week Jesus and His disciples sat down on the Mount of Olives and overlooked Jerusalem and the temple area. They asked Jesus "... what will be the sign of Your coming and the close of the age?" (Matthew 24:3 ESV) In His answer, Jesus mentioned various tribulations that will happen to those who believe and to the world in general.

Then Jesus told them: "Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then will appear in heaven the sign of the Son of Man, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. And He will send out His angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather His elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other" (Matthew 24:29-31 ESV).

Jesus has promised to return. Jesus promises to take **His elect** — all those who believe in Him as their Lord and Savior — to heaven to live there eternally with Him. However, only God the Father knows the date and the time of day when that will happen. The last day — judgment day — can happen at any moment!

Jesus wants us to be ready for His return. Jesus wants us to be faithful until we are called from this life through death if that occurs before He returns. Therefore, this total eclipse of the sun that is coming to the United States of America in August 2017 is yet another sign for all of us disciples of Jesus Christ to be ready as we wait for His return on the last day.

May the Holy Spirit help us use all the opportunities that come our way — including talking about a <u>total eclipse</u> of the sun — to encourage each other to be faithful to Jesus Christ as long as we live, to share our faith in Jesus with those who do not believe at this time, and to help others marvel at God's wonderful creation as we do!

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your hearts!




