
What a blessing it can be for us to be a Christian citizen of the good old USA!

Previously, teams and individuals had hung door hangers on about 125 neighborhood doors inviting children to participate. In fact one group of parents and children arrived with the invitation in hand! Although the number was down from 2017 when we had 31 children, this year's group included two families who were repeat visitors because they liked St. Timothy's Hunt so well.

The gospel was clearly shared by word and by the Holy Week craft the children constructed before the hunt. Six special baskets were given after the hunt to the gold and silver tag holders in the three different age categories. A funny incident happened when the silver tag was not found in any egg by the older group. What did they do but go out to the side lawn and looked for more eggs until they found the one with the silver tag inside!

As St. Timothy's largest evangelistic outreach of the year a good number of persons came to together to make the hunt a success. Patsy Simon organized the event and early on the helpers were Bill and Carol Hauge, Diane Herrick, Linda Gorsuch, Karl Simon, Roger and Kim Reinig. Mel Suelzle was the M. C., Pastor Flath prayed over the children, the Men's Group hid the eggs and helped lead groups as well as Beatrice Simon. It was a God pleasing event and joy filled. 




