February 2019 / March 2019 A.D. - THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sandy and I want to say a huge thank you for all of the letters, gifts, treats, and the monetary gift from members of the congregation that were given us this past Christmas season. We are so blessed by a loving and generous congregation! Again, from the bottom of our hearts, thank you!!

As many of you have already know, shortly after Christmas we headed down to the Los Angeles area to be part of The Lutheran Hour Ministries "Pedal Pushers" group. This group of volunteers helps to get many of the flowers and other vegetation (like Brussel spouts) ready to be placed, and then actually places them, on to some of the floats that were in this year's Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California on New Year's Day. (There were 19 floats in the building we worked in.)

Much of this work with the flowers is in the last few days before the parade in order to keep the flowers as fresh as possible. We began our <u>8 hour shift</u> at 8:00 am on Saturday December 29th. Sandy mainly worked with 100's of other people placing single roses into 3 or 4 inch vials filled with water. On the other hand, I was part of a 3 person detail that cut bundles of 12 long stem roses down to 8 inch lengths for people like Sandy to work with. Someone calculated that the 3 of us may have handled close to 220,000 roses that day (mainly hot ink and yellow). The day before (Friday) white and red roses were cut – and there were still more roses of various colors to be cut by the groups that followed us!!

We enjoyed viewing the Rose Parade in person on January 1. We saw how the things that we had worked on helped to make beautiful floats and especially The Lutheran Hour Ministry with the message: "Joy To The World, The Lord Has Come". Jesus Christ is the melody of life that brings the joy of forgiveness to sinners. The parade was seen by over 1 billion people – a wonderful way to get the Gospel of Jesus Christ into areas where it's hard to get in missionaries.

We were then told that for a day or two after the parade the floats would be on display for people to look at up close. But by the 2nd day many of the flowers would begin to wilt and fade away. So, the floats would be taken back to the buildings where they were decorated in and dismantled!! The flowers would be gathered up, ground up, and used for pig feed!

That whole process reminded me of a number of different Bible passages about flowers and plants. In a number of the parables that Jesus spoke, He included something about flowers and other vegetation. The sower sows the seed and the wheat grows. Certain flowers of the field are more lovely then king Solomon. And one of the names given to Christ the Lord in the Old Testament is "the Rose of Sharon" (Song of Solomon 2:1).

Isaiah the prophet writes this in Isaiah 40:8 (ESV) — "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever". Peter (1 Peter 1:24-25 (ESV)) repeats those words of Isaiah: "The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever". And Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away" (Luke 21:33).

Jesus' word brings with us hope for today, and hope for all our tomorrows; hope until we are called to our eternal home with Jesus in heaven, because "the Word of God stands forever". Therefore, the 4th verse of the hymn "Abide With Me" is a powerful, comforting verse to the disciple of Jesus. "Swift to its close ebbs out life's little day; earth's joys grow dim, its glories pass away; change and decay in all around I see; O Thou who changest not, abide with me". And Jesus does abide with us always!!

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your heart!



(supplied by LMSN).





Mylapore, Santhome, Chennai, India. The Basilica is built over the Tomb of St. Thomas.



Council Report - Mel Suelzle



December 31st marked the end of the first half of our fiscal year 2019. The financial results for this period are shown below. Our income was slightly below our plan at 98% or \$476 less than our budgeted income. This resulted from all types of contributions and income but EXCLUDES the income from the rental agreement for use of our parking lot during the week. Income also EXCLUDES \$4,253 contributed to our "New Strategy" dedicated fund. Expenses were 100% and only \$44 above our budgeted amount. As result our income after expenses was \$843 below our plan for the first half of the year. This

shortfall is entirely attributed to the lower contributions for the first half of the year. Strong December contributions helped reduce this shortfall caused by weak contributions of the summer months

When we received notice that our Call sent out in November was declined, our Call Committee met and decided to recommend we submit a call for a seminary graduate. This recommendation was approved by the Voters on December 23rd. The call documents were forwarded to the NW District office for approval and forwarding to the seminary. Given the size of this year's graduating class

we were asked if we would expand our call to include students serving their 4th and last year as Vicars. Our Call Committee unanimously voted their approval of this change on January 20th. We gave tentative approval to the District for communication to the Seminary so as to not further delay our call submission. Final approval is subject to final approval by the Voters at a meeting scheduled for February 3rd. We hope to have a good attendance at this meeting to review, discuss and approve this change to our Call.





To the Members of St. Timothy,

This marks my 10th year as a Member of St. Timothy. When I started, the second Sunday of each month was ushered by Charlie Stewart and Willie Whitfield. Charlie would read scripture the second Sunday. I loved his Oklahoma accent. Charlie's health no longer allows him to leave home, and Willie has put his house up for sale. He wants to be closer to his family.

To be an usher isn't a bad gig. Pastor puts up the hymn numbers, takes care of PA system, opens our Lectionary to the right scripture, etc. It is mostly passing out the bulletin, lighting the Alter candles, collecting the offerings, and putting the candles out after the service. If there is Communion, the big thing is to **not** have more than 10 at the Alter, and NOT to break up families (or friends).

Our numbers are now so small that the *idea* a person can do <u>just one thing</u> doesn't work. Gary, for example, is Trustee (which is the right job for him as he is loaded with mechanical knowledge), Elder, Communion Assistant, and usher. Rodger, Carol and I are sort of grounds trustees. Being an usher is sort of nice in that you don't have to deal with the hot sun in the summer, or walking the grounds with a blower or line trimmer. You also don't need to know how to operate a riding mower. When I learned to operate the riding mower, the first thing Rodger taught me was where the brake was. He told me, "If you are anywhere near Carol or I, HIT THE BRAKE!" Smart man!

Being an usher allows you to meet members, help the pastor with the service, and is a low stress job. I've never heard Pastor Flath complain. Sometimes, he will have us add something to the bulletin, but many times he does that himself. Please consider adding yourself to usher a Sunday. Carol and Linda are my newest ushers. They can verify that everyone is leery of anything the first time, but after a few Sundays, you know what needs to be done, and it's no big deal.
