## February / March 2020 A.D. - THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Lenten Season this year begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26. There will be a special service here at Saint Timothy that evening at 7:00 p.m. One of the things that is often mentioned during Lent is pain – the pain that our Lord and Savior went through on our behalf. A familiar reading during Lent that speaks about the pain that Christ Jesus went through is Isaiah 53. We read in verses 4 and 5 the following:

Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His wounds we are healed. (ESV)

Then we read or hear the accounts of Christ's crucifixion from the 4 Gospels. More about His pain, even His death on the cross. We need to hear and read about Jesus Christ's pain and what He went through to remind us that sin is no joking matter. At times we may think that sinning is nothing, but God doesn't. God laid all our sins (and the sins of everyone else) on His dear Son, Christ Jesus so that we would never have to face the holy wrath of God.

Why did Jesus go through all that pain?

In Hebrews 12:2 (ESV) we read this: "... Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, ...". Jesus endured all that pain for the joy that would come through His suffering and death. Jesus' joy is in the fact that you and I believe that He died for us and paid the price for our sins, that by faith we believe in His as our Savior, and that we are now His brothers and sisters.

Jesus went through all those pains because He loves all people, and He is gracious and forgiving.

Therefore, we join with believers of all times and places to thank Jesus Christ for enduring all that pain so that we might live with Him eternally in heaven. As a hymn writer put it: "Thousand, thousand, thanks shall be, dearest Jesus, unto Thee" (LSB 420 refrain).

May the love of the Lord Jesus always be in your heart!

## Council Report - Mel Suelzle




December 31<sup>st</sup> marked the end of the first half of our fiscal year 2020. The financial results for this period are shown below. Our income was below our plan at 96% or \$2,115 less than we had budgeted. This income resulted from all types of contributions and income but EXCLUDES the income from the rental agreement for use of our parking lot on week days. Income also EXCLUDES \$6,040 contributed to our "New Strategy" dedicated fund during this period as well. Helping to offset the lower than expected income was our expenses were below

our plan by almost 2%. As a result, our income after expenses was \$1,234 below our plan for the first half of the year. Most of this shortfall occurred during the summer months. Higher contributions than planned during Advent helped reduce our shortfall for the first half of the year. If you have any questions, or would like more details, please let me know.

During this past December, as approved at this December 8th Voter's meeting, we issued a call to Rev. Ryan Roehrig currently serving the St. Paul Lutheran Church in Alta, Iowa. On December 29<sup>th</sup>, Pastor Roehrig informed us that he has decided to retain his call at St. Paul Lutheran and return our call. (A copy of his formal letter is included in this newsletter.) This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> call attempt we have made that included 2 calls to ordained pastors and one call to a seminary graduate. Our call committee will be meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup> to consider our next step in our quest for a full-time pastor. The committee meetings will yield a proposal for our next steps to be

presented to the congregation for consideration and approval by Voters at a meeting scheduled during February.

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will offer their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at St Timothy Lutheran Church on January 27<sup>th</sup>. This is a make-up date for the January 13<sup>th</sup> date that was cancelled because of the snow. Life Screening has also scheduled another event for May 4<sup>th</sup> later this year. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading

cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. To register for this event visit


